- 5 Each party shall bear its own costs to the date of this order in respect of claim CO/1498/2015

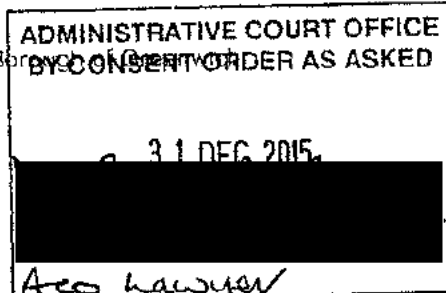

SCHEDULE

1. The Royal Borough of Greenwich shall not commission or publish more than four issues of Greenwich Time or any equivalent newspaper, newsheet or similar communication in the period of one year from 30 June 2016, and in subsequent years;
2. From 31 December 2015 publicity from the Royal Borough of Greenwich may include the regular and frequent communication of information to those residents who choose to receive such information by whatever medium they decide (e.g. paper or electronic) providing it does not have the appearance of a newspaper, newsheet or similar communication. This publicity may include information regarding: waste and recycling dates; deadlines and systems; school admissions deadlines and procedures; Council and partner job opportunities; choice based lettings; and other publicity about local authorities and the services they provide, in accordance with paragraph 29 of the 2011 Code of Recommended Practice on Local Authority Publicity, and
3. Hereinafter, the Royal Borough of Greenwich shall comply with the provisions of the 2011 Code of Recommended Practice on Local Authority Publicity to the full extent so far as it is in force.
